When the Marcus Historical Society was organized in 2007, we began working towards the goal of owning a building to collect and preserve Marcus antiques and keepsakes. Robert and Maxine Reed of Orlando FL, former Marcus residents, presented us with a large donation. The donation was large enough to allow us to purchase the old Danish Lutheran Church that is located at 208 Cedar St. The building was renamed the Reed Center in honor of Robert's parents, Carl and Hazel Reed.

The next step was to remodel and furnish the building. The first fundraiser for the Historical Society was the sale of Marcus calendars and playing cards. In August of 2008 there was a Grand Opening of the Reed Center during the Marcus fair. In a very short time the Reed Center was filled to capacity! It was a great starting place but the building was not handicap accessible. A new building was designed to be built on a lot at the Marcus Fairgrounds. By 2011 we were devoted

to make this dream come true and began lots of fundraising events! The new building was complete in August 2013 and we moved all of the historic memorabilia to the new Marcus Historical Building! A Grand Opening was held in August during the Marcus Fair. Over 800 people toured the new facility and were very impressed with the building and displays. The fundraising continued as there were still lots of bills and expenses. The generous donations kept coming from members, former residents of Marcus and surrounding communities, local organizations. Many businesses donated supplies and also labor. The donations combined with grants all allowed us to pay our debt! As of October 2014, we are debt free! THANK YOU to everyone who has been actively involved and those who have generously donated to the project! We will welcome donations for ongoing expenses and future projects.



## LOOKING BACK ON EVENTS OF 2014

In July, Brian Nelson made arrangements with the Fair Board to add to the existing sign on Hwy 143. It was arranged to have additional information added to the Marcus Fair sign noting directions to the new Historical Society building.



The most recent and largest fundraising event of the year was the sale of "[Book of Marcus Memories](#)". This project was created and edited by Arlene Hollenbeck with the assistance of Linda Spieler and Maxine Shea. This book is a collection of 32 stories written by current and former Marcus residents. We ordered 250 books. The shipment arrived the day before the Marcus Fair so we were able to sell several during the fair! The books have

been promoted at various events following the fair. Several were sold in September at the Grand Meadow Heritage Days and at the Kandy Korn Days at the Marcus Community Center. In October the Historical Society hosted the Chamber Coffee and the Cemetery Walk where more books were sold.

In November, the Catholic Daughter of America held their meeting and evening meal at our building. They took a tour of the building and purchased books.

The 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Cemetery Walk was held Oct 5<sup>th</sup>. It was a beautiful, warm, sunny day, which was perfect for the trolley ride and stroll through the cemetery. Jr. Pearson furnished the trolley and Russ Hansen served as the driver. Participants visited three gravesites in the Marcus Amherst cemetery and two in the Holy Name Cemetery. Then all gathered at the Methodist Church Social Hall to hear more detailed stories of each family. After the presentations, people could view family pictures and heirlooms, then enjoy refreshments. Thank you to Bev Nielsen for serving as chairperson of the kitchen committee, Phyllis Rapagani introducing the family presenters, and to Larry Rapagani for doing the video filming. Presenters included Barb McIntire representing the Sven Sjostrom family, Dan Ohlendorf representing the Cpl. Henry Ohlendorf family, and Jerry Pallesen representing the Nels Pallesen family. Ilia O'Brien represented the Theodore and Charlotte Treinen family and Doug Lauters presented the history of Ray and Mary Lauters. Linda Wheeler and Nancy Hier have been doing a great job of organizing this event for many years!



We sold several books and decks of cards at the Hometown Christmas event in December. Our Christmas tree at the Community Center was decorated with paper snowflakes and photos of various snowstorms and blizzards that occurred in past years in Marcus.
